Total Nonfarm Employment Increased by 71,900 Jobs Year Over Year in June 2023 Arizona Unemployment Increased to 3.5%

The Arizona seasonally adjusted (SA) unemployment rate increased to 3.5% in June 2023 from 3.4% in May 2023. The U.S. SA unemployment rate decreased to 3.6% in June 2023 from 3.7% in May 2023.

Month over month, Arizona's SA labor force increased by 8,307 individuals, or 0.2%. Year over year, the SA labor force increased by 62,429 individuals, or 1.7%.

Month over month, Arizona not-seasonally adjusted (NSA) total nonfarm employment decreased by 39,800 jobs. Year over year, NSA total nonfarm employment increased by 71,900 jobs, or 2.4%. Arizona SA total nonfarm employment increased by 2,800 individuals, or 0.1%, month over month.

Month Over Month

Arizona NSA nonfarm employment decreased by 39,800 jobs in June. Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), NSA nonfarm employment lost 51,600 jobs on average in June. The private sector recorded a loss of 1,500 jobs in June, led by losses in Leisure & Hospitality (-4,300 jobs) and Private Education & Health Services (-1,500 jobs). Prior to the pandemic (2010-2019), private sector employment averaged a loss of 8,900 jobs in June. The government sector¹ recorded a loss of 38,300 jobs in June, less than the pre-pandemic (2010-2019) average loss of 42,700 jobs. Employment losses in the government sector occurred primarily within Local Government Education (-31,100 jobs).



Year Over Year


Arizona NSA nonfarm employment increased by 71,900 jobs or 2.4% in June year over year. Private sector employment increased by 58,100 jobs year over year, while government employment increased by 13,800 jobs year over year.



Arizona NSA Year-Over-Year Employment Gain/Loss by Sector




Arizona & U.S. Unemployment Rate















Arizona & U.S. Employment Services Year-to-Year Percent Change
